Collective Worship


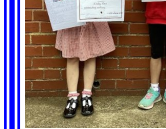
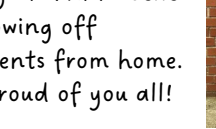
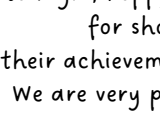
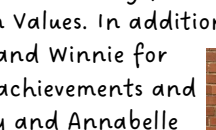
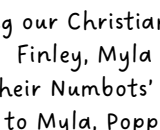
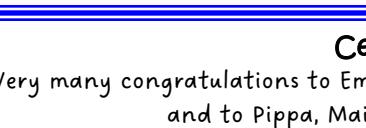
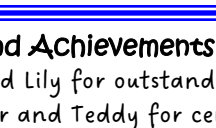
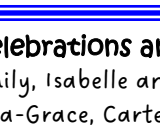
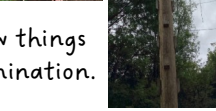
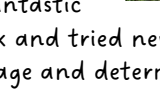
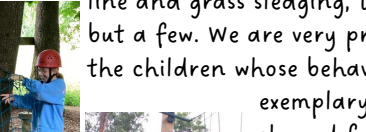
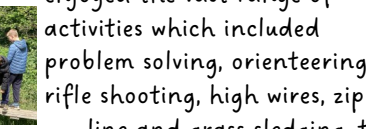

Pompeii Performance

In their English this week, LKS2 have been exploring how the characters in their class text may have felt as they started to realise that something was happening in Pompeii. The children created a 'conscience alley' in which they repeated descriptive phrases, helping the characters, Tranio and Livia, to imagine they were there. They then listened to their thoughts and feelings about the events which was then developed into a short dramatic scene which was created in teams with a narrator to keep the story moving along.
