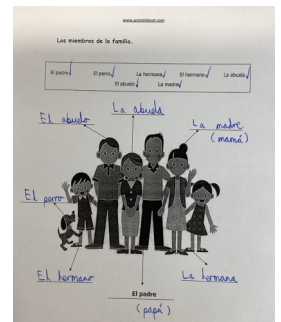


Golden Worship

Due to Arts' Day, we have postponed our achievement celebration to Monday 16th May to celebrate values, outstanding work and achievements from home.

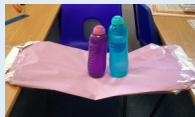
Hola España!

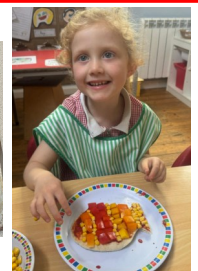
PSHE - The Bridge of 'Yet'
