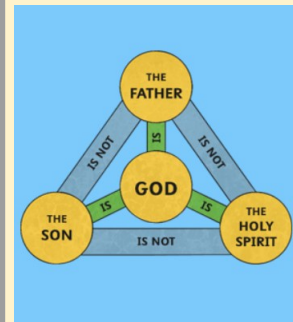

Congratulations to UKS2 who had the highest attendance last week and Reception who had 97.2% attendance this week.

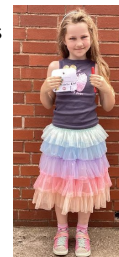
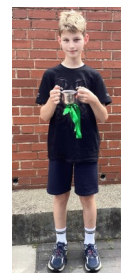


Celebrations and Achievements

Practice makes Perfect!

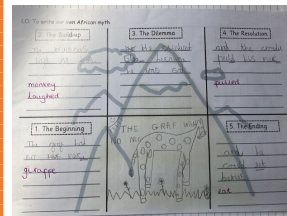
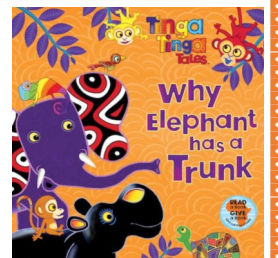
Rehearsals for the KS2 Production are up and running and the children are working hard to practice lines, learning how to project their voices and remembering stage directions.

A World of Colour in EYFS

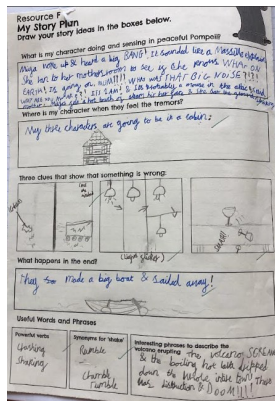

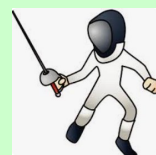
