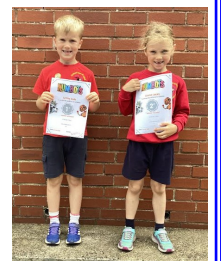


Celebrations and Achievements

We are very proud of you all!



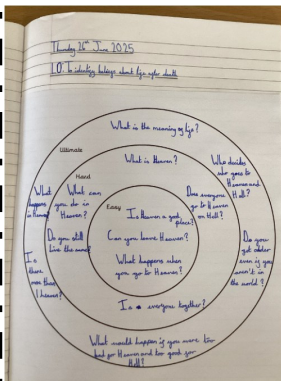
Wake up Wednesday

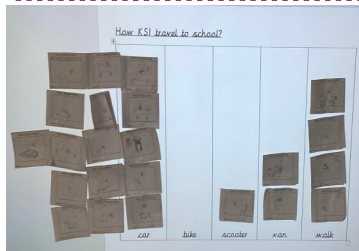
Thought Provoking Questions in UKS2

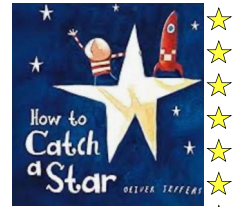

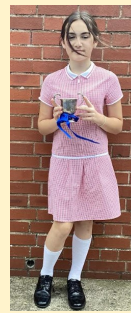
EYFS Reach for the Stars!
