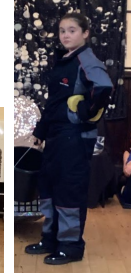
School Daze

Moments Matter, Attendance Counts

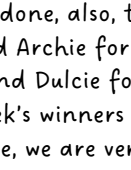
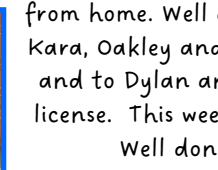
Our whole school attendance this week was 96.35% and to date is 95.45%.

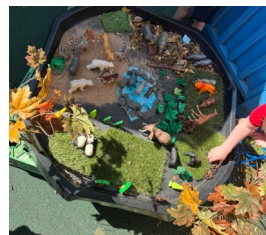


Postcards and Punctuation
