Geography: What makes the United Kingdom? We will be naming and locating counties and cities of the United Kingdom, and looking at geographical regions with their identifying human and physical characteristics, key topographical features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers), and land-use patterns, understanding how some of these aspects have changed over time. We will also be developing our use of the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and keys (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build our knowledge of the United Kingdom.

Title of Unit of Enquiry:

A Tiny Island

English: Poetry and Persuasion - After The Fall, Bloom, The Last Tree

Our English texts promote positive mental health and wellbeing and are linked to themes of resilience, caring for ourselves and others, and building positive relationships. Through our exploration of these texts, we will be drawing inferences about characters and making predictions from what we have read. Our writing will be based on composing and rehearsing ideas orally and through discussion, and then following the editing process to make improvements to our own work. We will be producing acrostic poems based upon a given theme and preparing persuasive cases to share our opinions about topics.

Art: William Morris

This half term we will be exploring the artwork created by William Morris. Throughout this topic the children will be improving their mastery of art and design techniques, using a range of materials. Children will be experimenting with a range of printing techniques including, collagraph, lino and paint. They will also be practising their sketching skills to replicate patterns designs inspired by William Morris.

Music: Bringing Us Together

We will be working together on a disco song about friendship, peace, hope and unity. This will involve listening to and appraising music from the disco genre, performing songs, and using our creativity to develop our performance.

Science: Help Our Habitats

In our Science learning, we will be considering our local environment and how we can support it. Our focus will be on regenerating an area for wildlife and considering what would be needed to do this. We will learn about wildlife and their habitats, how their environments have changed and what we can do to help them.

Maths: Number - Place Value, Addition and Subtraction

In our Maths learning, we will be focusing on recognising the place value of each digit in a 3-digit number, comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000, representing numbers in different ways, adding and subtracting mentally and using formal methods, and also solving problems using all of these methods.

MFL: German

We will be learning the basics about Germany and its culture, along with some everyday phrases and vocabulary to introduce us to a new language.

PSHE: HeartSmart – Don't Forget To Let The Love In.

We will be discussing ways in which we can be more resilient, promote our own wellbeing and build healthy relationships with others.

RE: What do Christians learn from the Creation Story?

We will be thinking about the concepts of God and Creation, and how Christians respond and behave according to these.
